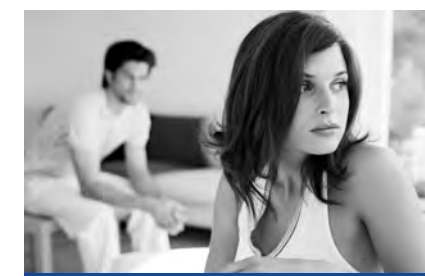

Can you imagine the amount of strength it took this woman to stand against all and say no to abortion? She adamantly claims that she did not abort because her Birthright volunteer believed in her.

We are eager and ready to continue this journey with her. She starts by asking many questions about insurance, prenatal care, and delivery. She needs to find a place to live as she moved out of her boyfriend's apartment and onto a neighbor's couch. She is interested in participating in our Prepare to Parent Program. Her face is animated and all smiles as she begins to dream and to plan for her future and her baby.

WE DO and it's one of our greatest joys! Most of our clients will bring their new baby to the Birthright office for a visit. When we walk with someone through a crisis pregnancy they become very special to us. When we see their new baby, we respond as if they are family – they feel like family to us. We shower the baby with gifts and take pictures and give many hugs. In the coming weeks the volunteer will check on the new mom with phone calls and visits as we know that now that the baby is born she will feel tired, overwhelmed, fearful, excited, happy, and unsure. Our prayer is that Birthright's help will assist as the woman transitions into motherhood.

I recently visited a client in the hospital the day after she gave birth to a beautiful little girl, Sophie. I can't describe the awe I felt being there. I marveled at how natural and calm the mother was with her newborn. This same woman had many worries and obstacles as she walked through her pregnancy without the baby's father or her family by her side. Now there is only peace and happiness.

Her Birthright volunteer stayed with her throughout the delivery and over the first night. This isn't something that we are normally asked to do, but when we are it is an honor to witness and assist in the miracle of birth. This will be an experience the volunteer will never ever forget. The last birth I attended was 15 years ago and to remember it still fills my heart with joy.

As I sat and watched Sophie and her mom I kept hearing in my heart; **This is why you are here. This is why Birthright is here.** Sometimes my job is really hard but moments like this make it worth it. This summer I will be celebrating 21 years as the director of Birthright of Bel Air.
